Qualification Requirements:

To qualify for a Latent Print Examiner Certification, one must:

- Be employed by a recognized law enforcement agency.
- Be currently assigned to Latent Print Examiner duties.
- Complete all required courses (as required by the Georgia Peace Officer Standards & Training Council).
- Complete and pass a third-party latent print proficiency exam from an ISO/IEC 17043 accredited provider.
- Recertify every two years by completing and passing the third-party latent print proficiency exam.
